



Books are referred to as a man's best friend and of course, they should be! Today's youth will be tomorrow's leaders only if they are guided by the golden principles given in good books.



had prepared much better than the winner. She was devastated and was more worried about missing a golden opportunity than winning the prize.



Youth organizations are constantly trying to spread awareness and encourage people to take action






against it. They even succeed in their endeavours as many young activists have gained recognition from government and international organizations for their commendable efforts.




